

Expanding Class Times:

Due to our large number of students, and continued growth we have decided to expand the opportunities for classes. This year we will be offering two classes for each class, except Fundamentals of the Faith. Classes will be from **10:00 a.m. - 10:50 a.m.** and from **11:30 a.m. - 12:20 p.m.** Please note that there are 25 spaces available in each class. Please sign up for the time that will best suit your family - this will be the class that you attend for the entire year.

Overview of Structure:

Intellectual and Spiritual formation for our youth is crucial; especially in today's secular world. It is, therefore, most desirable that the youth at our parish be able to enter into and remain in ongoing religious education and formation. These classes are NOT meant to be thought of as "options" for us to decide which ones our youth will attend. Rather, the entire CCD program is to be thought of as a whole program. It is our desire that once enrolled in our program, each child will progress through the various classes in order to better be formed in the faith and prepared not only for reception of the sacraments, but also to live a fully authentic Catholic life.

Syllabus of Classes:

First Communion Class (Ages 7-8):

This class aims at preparing children for reception of the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion. The preparation begins in a year-long class in which children receive general instruction in their Catholic faith and a life lived in relationship with Christ. Learning how to pray, examining the difference between right and wrong, studying the Ten Commandments, and beginning to understand the importance of each sacrament are guideposts in starting each child's personal life in Christ.

Requirements:

1. Children must be at least 7 years old.
2. A copy of the child's baptismal certificate must be presented at the time of registration.
3. Text Provided - Ignatius Press Faith and Life series, grade 2, and selected materials.

Instructor:

Ms. Sharon Grossklas received her bachelor's degree in Special Education from Northern Illinois University, and her master's degree in Reading Education (with certification as a Reading Specialist) from Dominican University. Since 2005 she has been teaching as a special education teacher in the Southwest suburbs. Sharon has been a parishioner of St. John Cantius since 1993, and has volunteered at the parish in a variety of capacities over the years.

Old Testament Class (Ages 8-9):

One of the foundational areas of focus for an authentically lived catholic life is knowledge of our own tradition and heritage. Spending a year studying, reading, and praying with the books and stories of the Old Testament afford each child time to become personally familiar with these important stories and histories of our faith. Familiarity with the Old Testament naturally leads one to have a deeper understanding and appreciation for the New Testament.

Requirements:

1. Children must have made their First Communion.
2. Text - Holy Bible and assorted materials.

Instructor:

Ms. Tori Palmer received a bachelor's of Music Education and master's of Education in English for Speakers of Other Languages from Mid America Nazarene University. She was a teacher for 12 years, 10 of which were spent overseas in Korea. Throughout that time, she taught English as a foreign language and music for all ages kindergarten through high school. She first came to St. John Cantius last August and was captivated by the lively nature of the parish. She is involved in St. Dominic's Rosary making class and sings in the Resurrection choir. New Testament Class (Ages 9-10):

Transitioning from a deeper familiarity of the Old Testament previously, children now begin to pour over the important passages of the New Testament. The four Gospel accounts should be texts that each student has a basic knowledge of and personal relationship to. Beyond just a general knowledge of these writings, the hope of this class is that children will see and understand the Good News of Christ's coming among men.

1. Children must have made their First Communion.
2. Text - Holy Bible and assorted materials.

Confirmation A (Ages 10-11):


This first year of Confirmation preparation will begin the child's first steps towards an individual ownership of their faith. Building upon their knowledge of the Old and New Testaments, children in this class will start to examine the broader tradition of the Church as well as how to live a life of Catholic discipleship. Full participation in the life of the Church is the goal of this class; participation in which student are able to articulate their faith both corporately and personally.

Requirements:

1. Children must have made their First Communion.
2. Text Provided - Ignatius Press Faith and Life series, grade 6.

Instructor:

Dr. Mike Knapp taught students from elementary to middle school, undergraduate to graduate levels for over 33 years, mostly in the sciences. He's also a former protestant pastor of over 20 years. Class Location: St. Peter's Classroom

Confirmation B (Ages 11-12):

The program is structured as a pilgrimage towards the great day of Confirmation. It will contain three inseparable elements: Prayer, study and witness. These will be expressed through class prayer, a retreat and discussion about friendship with Christ, a comprehensive review of the Catechism, supernatural destiny and the purpose of life, and service to the poor, the elderly and the Gospel of Life.

Requirements:

1. Children must have made their First Communion.
2. A copy of the child's baptismal certificate must be presented at the time of registration.
3. Text Provided - Ignatius Press Faith and Life series, grade 7.

Instructor:

Mr. Bill Melichar grew up in the Chicago west suburbs and has been a parishioner of St. John Cantius since 1998. A graduate of Loyola University Law School, he volunteers as an attorney representing the best interests of children in guardianship cases. In 2018 he completed a master's degree in dogmatic theology summa cum laude with a published thesis on the Mariology of St. Therese and subsequent concentration on the teaching of St. Thomas Aquinas.

Fundamentals of the Faith (Ages 12-17):

This course takes an in-depth look at the first half of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. Benedict XVI, in his Apostolic Letter *Porta Fidei* for the beginning of the Year of Faith in 2012, expressed the desire that many people will “feel a strong need to know better and to transmit to future generations the faith of all times” (Benedict XVI, Apost. Letter, *Porta Fidei*). The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* is not a mere collection of doctrines. It provides the groundwork for understanding what we Catholics believe. The purpose of the course is to engage with the material and come to a better understanding (and love) of our Catholic Faith.

Requirements:

1. Children must have made their Confirmation.
2. Texts are Provided

Instructor:

We want to help our children navigate safely today's society. This class does fulfill the requirements of the Archdiocese of Chicago for all parishes' Religious Education programs. The lesson this year will focus on Boundaries and Friendships." The class will be taught at an age-appropriate level. It is important that all students attend this class.

If there is any reason that would prohibit a student from attending, we ask that you complete the "opt-out" form and turn it in by the date of the class.

The date for the "Teaching Safety – Empowering God's Children" class will be on Sunday, January 8th, 2023.

Additional Information:

Orientation - Sunday, September 11th:

Orientation is required of all students AND their parents. We will meet in the Parish Hall at 10:00am and 11:30am to go over the year, expectations and to introduce the instructors to their classes.

Please Note: The class time you sign up for is the orientation time you will attend.

All classes begin promptly at 10:00 a.m. or 11:30am and finish at 10:50 a.m. or 12:20pm. Special arrangements can be made for those who may need to leave early (either to sing in a choir or serve for Mass).

- ALL students in the **First Communion Class** will NOT be released from the classroom until a parent or sibling presents themselves to pick up the student. The other classes will be released on their own.
- If anyone other than a parent or sibling will pick up your child, please send an email authorizing what day this will occur or write it on the registration form.

Attendance: Email notification to the class instructor is necessary for an excused absence. Otherwise, more than *three unexcused absences* will result in the student to possibly be dismissed from the program. If you have any questions, please contact Fr. Joshua at the parish office, 312-243-7373.

- N.B. Programs, sports, recitals, vacations are not acceptable reasons for absence and are considered UNEXCUSED.

Class Cancellations: Classes may be canceled due to inclement weather. You will be notified by e-mail the night before or early morning if classes are canceled.

Behavioral Issues: If behavior problems occur the instructor will correct the student as needed. If problems persist the parents will then be notified and if necessary, the student may be dismissed from the program.

Primary Educators: St. John Cantius recognizes and respects the primary role of the parents in the education of their own children. The means used for this education fall within the prerogative of the parents. However, the administration of the sacraments is the responsibility of the pastor.

- Archdiocesan policy states: *“The pastor or his designate shall determine the readiness of children in light of their disposition and preparation prior to the first reception of the sacraments.”* (Canons 777& 914)
- Therefore, it is not permissible to present your child for any of these sacraments unless and until the child has been determined ready by the pastor.

Our Café San Giovanni, open on most Sundays of the year, is the meeting place for our parishioners and friends before and after Mass. The Café is located in the lower level of the Church where churchgoers can obtain coffee and other refreshments, including breakfast items, for a modest donation. It is also an excellent place just to relax and visit with family and friends.



Language Classes:

Language Class Information:

Have you always wanted a deeper appreciation of our Church's languages and heritage? St. John Cantius' language classes offer a chance to begin or to continue your study of the language and history of the Church.

We offer a range of Latin classes through which you can develop from complete beginner to fluent reader of original texts. You can progress from the beginner class through to the advanced reading classes, or you can join at any point along the way if you already have some background in the language. Classes are one hour a week, so we move at a pace that allows you to learn whilst not interfering with work and / or other study commitments.

We focus on ecclesiastical Latin – the Latin of the liturgy, Jerome's Bible, scholastic philosophers, papal bulls and canon law – but the course will also set you in good stead if your interest is in classical Latin. Many of the texts we read in the advanced reading classes are from the classical age.

We usually run two semesters a year: A fall class from September through December and a spring class from January through June. Beginner classes start each September. We also offer occasional classes on various topics, including the popular 'Latin of the Mass' class which provides an introduction to the Latin of the Mass for those who may not wish to pursue formal studies in Latin.

The course is designed for adults, but we do not impose a strict minimum age.

The 2022 fall semester begins on **September 11, 2022** and ends on **December 18, 2022**.

All classes will be held in person (with one exception – see final offering below). Classes meet on Sundays in the St Joseph Building at 1025 West Fry St., Chicago, IL. Enter the building from the south door between the St. Joseph Building and the Church (there is no entry directly from the street).

Registration for Classes: You can register by contacting the instructor by email prior to the class, or by registering in person at the St. Joseph Building on September 11th, the first day of Class. If you would like to join any class after September 11th, please contact the instructor.

Payment for Classes: You can pay the registration fee through our Give Central page. This is not registration - you still need to contact the instructor or register in person.

Purchase of Textbooks: You can purchase all textbooks in advance at Biretta Books, or you can purchase your textbook in the St. Joseph Building on the first day of class.

Latin I

*Classes start September 11 and will be held from
9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.*

Instructor: Mr. Andre Mendoza

This course is intended to be a first introduction to the Latin language. Without assuming any prior experience with Latin or any other foreign language, we will cover the most basic elements of Latin grammar, pronunciation, and vocabulary, following the progression of our textbook *Lingua Latina: Familia Romana* with its companion exercise book *Exercitia Latina* and, later in the course, Collins' *A Primer of Ecclesiastical Latin*. While the content will be introductory and steady, students should expect to devote at least a few hours each week to reviewing the lessons and working through the exercises.

Classes will be held in person on Sundays.

The cost is \$50.00 for the class. You can buy the *Lingua Latina* plus *Exercitia Latina* textbooks at Biretta Books or at the St. Joseph Building immediately before the first class.

Latin II

*Classes start September 11 and will be held from
9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.*

Instructor: Mr. Rupert Ward

This class is for the beginner with some prior Latin study. Classes will cover conjugation of verbs, declension of nouns/adjectives and an introduction to reading and writing Latin. The textbook is Collins' *A Primer of Ecclesiastical Latin*. The class will begin at Unit 13.

Classes will be held in person on Sundays.

The cost is \$50.00 for the class and \$35.00 for the textbook. You can buy the textbook at Biretta Books or at the St. Joseph Building immediately before the first class.

For the more advanced student with some prior Latin study. Classes will review the later chapter of Collins' *A Primer of Ecclesiastical Latin* beginning with Unit 26.

Classes will be held in person on Sundays.

The cost is \$50.00 for the class and \$35 for the Collins textbook. You can buy the textbook at Biretta Books or at the St. Joseph Building immediately before the first class.

Latin IV

Classes start September 11 and will be held from
10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

Instructor: Mr. Andre Mendoza

For the more advanced student with some prior Latin study. This course will guide students through the end of the textbook *A Primer of Ecclesiastical Latin* by Collins. Extended readings will be taken from *Lingua Latina* starting from Chapter 10. At the end of the course, having seen the entirety of Latin syntax and morphology and developed reading speed through extended readings, students will be prepared for translating selected original texts.

Class will be held in person on Sundays.

The cost is \$50.00 for the class and \$35 for the Collins textbook. Extracts from *Lingua Latina* will be provided as necessary. You can buy the Collins textbook at Biretta Books or at the St. Joseph Building immediately before the first class.

Latin V

*Classes start September 11 and will be held from

Instructor: Mr. Christopher Jones

We will read and discuss selected Latin texts reflecting the rise and development of Christianity in the first six centuries AD. There is no textbook; excerpts will be provided by the instructor. The instructor is preparing a textbook for future students; input from this class will be a valuable part of that process. Intermediate and advanced students are welcome.

Classes will be held in person on Sundays from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. The same class will also be held on Sundays from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Participants may choose which of the two classes to attend.

The cost is \$50.00 for the class. There is no textbook; readings will be provided by the instructor.

Online Introduction to Latin Grammar

*Classes start September 10 and will be held from
11:15 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.*

Instructor: Mr. Richard Rodriguez

This class is for students who live outside the Chicago area and/or who have substantial difficulty in attending in-person sessions.

This class is for the complete beginner – No prior knowledge of Latin is required. The focus of the course will be on reading for familiarity and grammatical comprehension with the assistance of a translation (e.g., ability to more thoroughly use & appreciate Latin/English parallel text worship materials). Optional exercises will be provided upon request for students who are interested in developing a higher degree of unaided reading fluency. The textbook is Collins' *A Primer of Ecclesiastical Latin*. This class will cover units 1-9.

Classes will be held on Saturdays ON ZOOM from 12:15am–12:15pm.

The cost is \$50.00 for the class. Students should obtain their own copy of the textbook.

Latin of the Mass
